# Q&A

Creative Europe Desk Italy - coordinated by the Directorate-General for Contemporary Creativity of the Ministry of Culture - participates with a conference co-organized with the Creative Europe Desk Croatia which will be introduced by the two Italian and Croatian desks and will be divided into two stages: Cultural Heritage and Sustainable Cultural Tourism. For the cultural heritage, two projects co-financed by Creative Europe will be presented: CREAMARE, dedicated to the underwater cultural heritage, and A SEA CHANGE, curated by KONTEJNER / BIRO SUVREMENE UMJETNICKE PRAKSE which addresses the issues of the blue economy in the life of coastal communities in a direct and targeted way. The section dedicated to sustainable cultural tourism will be entirely dedicated to the Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe. During the speech we will talk about the Phoenicians' Route, the Olive Tree Route and the Iter Vitis Route.
